About the Orchestra

ISD709, Duluth Public Schools, has proudly maintained an active orchestra program for over seventy years. Historically, the program offered instruction from third grade through high school, including an elementary music magnet school. Currently, budget constraints allow for middle school orchestra ensembles by grade level, with separate 6th and 7th-grade ensembles meeting twice a week. Additionally, there is an advanced ensemble, which meets four times a week to include all 8th graders plus 6th and 7th graders that may audition for acceptance into the ensemble.

At Lincoln Park Middle School, the orchestra program is led by teacher Samantha Amys, with Grant Carl serving as the co-teacher. At Ordean East Middle School, Tami L. Nelson directs the orchestra. ISD709's high school ensembles meet daily. Denfeld High School offers one homogeneous ensemble under the direction of Samantha Amys. East High School has four ensembles, directed by Byron Klimek, that also meet daily.

Ordean East Middle School, with a student population of 1,080, is led by Principal Susan Lehna, whose ongoing support has greatly contributed to the success and growth of the orchestra program. The advanced orchestras have proudly performed at MNSOTA since the 1990s, a tradition that remains a highlight of the program. The program continues to grow, with recent initiatives including holiday serenades through the school halls, spring pep rally performances alongside the band, and the formation of a new fiddle band. Meeting weekly, the fiddle band explores Scandinavian and Old-Time fiddle music, fostering connections within the community and expanding the students' musical repertoire.

Chippewa Middle School, located in North Oaks, Minnesota, offers a comprehensive orchestra program as part of its commitment to providing diverse and enriching educational experiences. The 8th Grade Orchestra is composed of 81 students under the direction of Brian Larson. There are two sections of this orchestra that rehearse daily for 48 minutes. Students also receive lessons and sectionals taught by Dr. Daniel Keeler three days a week. The Chippewa Middle School Eighth Grade Orchestra has performed at the MNSOTA State Middle Level Festival several times in previous years.

Chippewa Middle School, led by principal Molly Hollihan, has 1,104 students in grades 6-8 with over 260 students participating in orchestra.
